About our Club...

Awana clubs meet on Sunday night from 5:00 to 6:50pm during the school year at NHCC.

Preschool through 6th grade

Awana club nights consist of an exciting game time, a Bible lesson time and a handbook time. Clubbers earn their uniform, awards, and shares (for store night) as they complete work in their handbooks.

Children starting Awana receive an entrance booklet. Upon completion of the entrance booklet, clubbers are eligible to purchase a handbook and an Awana uniform (financial assistance available). The handbooks include Bible memorization and activities. Parents are encouraged to work with their children in the handbooks.

Clubbers earn Awana shares for handbook work and club attendance. We have an Awana Store throughout the year where clubbers may redeem their shares for prizes. Donations for the store are welcome. All children are recognized at the Awards Ceremony at the end of the year.



Cubbies is for preschoolers 3 years old by Sept. 15 up to starting kindergarten. Mary Yoesel is the Cubbie's Director (392-2458).



Sparks is for children in kindergarten through 2nd grade. Kim Swartz is Sparks Director (227-7668).



Truth and Training (T&T) is for those in 3rd through 6th grades. T&T is the ultimate adventure for this age.

It is designed to start all youth with the plan of salvation. Eight discoveries each year are foundational for Christian growth. Donna Norris is T&T Director (534-0196).

Leaders in Training (LIT) is for those in grades 7-12 who are interested in assisting / training to be leaders in AWANA.

RULES

Be on time! Opening ceremony starts at 5:00 p.m. Bring your Bible and handbook and wear your uniform to each meeting.

Tennis shoes, pants (or shorts) and modest shirts should be worn by all Clubbers for an active game time. You must behave properly at all times. If a clubber does not follow the club rules, parents may be asked to take them home.

When you hear any leader counting from 1 to 5, be very quiet immediately and listen for instructions.

At the end of the club, parents must pick up their children **INSIDE** the building. No children will be permitted to leave the building unsupervised.

Cost

NHCC Awana clubs are financed partially through clubber dues. Dues are \$20 annually (no more than \$50 per family). Clubbers are also responsible for the purchase of their uniforms and handbooks. (Financial assistance is available as we do not want the cost to prevent any child from attending – please speak with the Commander or Secretary if needed.)

If AWANA is cancelled due to bad weather, leaders will call clubbers.
